Hygiene	<ul> <li>Infection being pass on between those attending</li> <li>Infection from recov litter</li> </ul>		H	<ul> <li>The person leading the event will be responsible for ensuring that all control measures are in place and all actions are completed before she/he leaves the event</li> <li>All equipment must be thoroughly cleaned before the event takes place</li> <li>Names, addresses and phone numbers of all involved in the event must be recorded for NHS Track and Trace purposes</li> <li>Hand sanitizers (containing at least 60% alcohol) must be available, and used throughout the event</li> <li>Social distancing will be maintained at all times by those involved in the event and members of the public</li> <li>Ask people attending the event to follow the guidance given by the Government on coughing or sneezing by covering with a tissue and throwing it in a bin</li> <li>Clean and disinfect, with a disinfectant wipe before, and during, the event frequently touched objects and surfaces</li> <li>Clear instructions must be given to all participants, that litter must be collected only using litter sticks and litter must not be picked up directly using hands</li> </ul>

5. Distributing equipment	Infection being passed on	Н	Н	<ul> <li>Keep a safe distance of 2 metres when distributing</li> <li>Allow yourself plenty of time</li> <li>Check you have all equipment before the day itself</li> <li>When the equipment is taken back, any parts that have been touched should be wiped with disinfectant wipes</li> <li>Wipes must be safely disposed of</li> </ul>
6. Refreshments	Infection being passed on	Н	Н	<ul> <li>All those involved will, if required, take their own drink and food. No food or drink will be shared between people attending the event</li> <li>Gloves must be removed and hands sanitized before handling food or drink</li> </ul>
7. End of the event	Infection being passed on	Н	Н	<ul> <li>A pack of disinfectant wipes will be available in each group</li> <li>any equipment used will be wiped with disinfectant wipes</li> <li>The wipes must be disposed of in a bin</li> <li>gloves should be placed by each individual directly into a specified bag for them to be taken away and washed</li> </ul>
